<b>ARRIVAL &amp; DEPARTURE</b>	Arrive <b>Sunday</b> before course starts. Depart <b>Sunday</b> after course ends.
<b>COURSE DATES:</b>	Minimum booking is two weeks.
<b>COURSE :</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <b>IELTS course</b> – 25 lessons a week (45 minutes each lesson). You need to pass IELTS with a level 7 to work in the UK. If this is your aim, you should have B2+/C1 level English when joining this four-week course.</li> </ul> <p>Classes are small (maximum 12 students) and course materials and the use of course books are included in your fee. You have free access to the self-study centre after your lessons Monday – Friday.</p>
<b>SOCIAL PROGRAMME:</b>	There are social and cultural activities from Monday to Friday - a small charge is made for most activities.
<b>ACCOMMODATION:</b>	<p>You stay with a family - this will help improve your English more quickly.</p> <p>You'll have a single room - breakfast and evening meal every day.</p>
